Introduction

ACLS for health care providers course is designed to teach the skills needed to assess and administer care within the first 10 minutes of an adult VF/VT (ventricular fibrillation/ventricular tachycardia) arrest. Participants will learn the skills needed to manage advanced cardiac life support scenarios.

Our Regional Cardiac Centre opened in 2003. Pre-Requisite Recommendations

This course does not teach basic CPR skills, rhythm interpretation, or ACLS pharmacology. It is recommended that the participants come with current CPR certification, basic knowledge of life threatening arrhythmias, and ACLS pharmacology. It is also recommended the participants review the ACLS Provider Manual prior to the course.
