- 1. The data for sexual identity should be interpreted with caution due to high sampling variability. Further, this number is an underestimate of the true LGTBQ+ population in Waterloo Region because the survey question only asks about homosexual and bisexual identity.

Refers to those that identify as 'aboriginal' on the census and includes persons who are First Nations (North American Indian), Metis or Inuk (Inuit) and/or those who are Registered or Treaty Indians (that is, registered under the Indian Act of Canada) and/or those who have membership in a First Nation or Indian band. The counts of Aboriginal peoples from the census can be affected by issues of under coverage.
